Automobile
Insurance Do

You Need?


If you do not have adequate car insurance, you are dependent upon an atfault driver having adequate insurance to cover your medical bills, lost wages and pain and suffering damages if you are injured in a collision. You will need more than minimal coverages to protect you and your family or passengers from inadequate insurance policy limits. If you have been injured before, you will need even more protection since your second recovery may be slower than the first and require more medical care. We recommend a minimum of\$100,000 UM/UIM insurance coverage and for our Maryland clients, a minimum of \$5,000 in PIP. These amounts will be insufficient for most traumatic brain injuries, prolonged medical care and most injuries requiring surgery.

MEDICAL MALPRACTICE - DO YOU HAVE A CASE?

There are three simple elements to such a case: (1) Did a medical doctor violate a standard of care in the medical profession meaning did the doctor do something or fail to do something that other doctors would generally do and not fail to do; (2)

Did the violation alleged cause the specific injury and harm the patient suffered; and (3) The nature and extent of the injury.

Unless the nature and extent of the injury involves catastrophic injury, that is, death or a long-term, permanent damage which impairs a person's activities of daily living, the case will be not be economically feasible. Examples of damages which will make a case feasible are: loss of a loved one, amputation of a limb, loss of reproductive capacity, loss of mobility, brain damage, permanent damage to the spine, loss of speech or hearing.
